

# Daws Hill Planning Referendum Information Statement

A referendum relating to the adoption of the Daws Hill Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Thursday 14 November 2019.

The question that will be asked in the referendum is as follows:

**“Do you want Wycombe District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Daws Hill to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?”**

The referendum area is identical to the area that has been designated as the Daws Hill Neighbourhood area. A map of the referendum area is included below on page 3.

A person is entitled to vote in the referendum if on Thursday 14 November 2019:

- He or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the referendum area.
- His or her qualifying address for the election is in the referendum area. (A person’s qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be registered.)

The expenses limit that will apply in relation to the referendum is  $£2,362 + (1,073 \times £0.059) = £2425$ .

The number of persons entitled to vote in the referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated 1,073.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures similar to those used at local government elections.
