Dear Sir/Madam It is obviously good practice for local areas to draw up neighbourhood plans as they can then be referenced by planning authorities as well as considered by potential developers. The CCG along with member GP practices in this area of Buckinghamshire are aware of your draft plan and would like to make the following comments.

Comments:

Infrastructure Access to GP appointments is a national issue and we are

working to promote different ways of offering consultations to cope with the increase in demand. Nationally primary care providers will need to look at new models of care, using the skillsets of different types of clinical professions to offset the demand from increased patient numbers. Additionally there needs to be a focus on patient education to understand the correct use of GP appointments as there has been an increase in inappropriate use of GP time. The CCG has been consulted by Wycombe District Council on the longer term local plans and has submitted a response stating our commitment to the provision of adequate and appropriate primary care facilities to meet the needs of the local population. All developments in the area will pose a real challenge to local GP practices in terms of infrastructure: • Accessing the clinical team based on capacity versus demand for appointments • Car parking • Infrastructure i.e. the need for more consulting space and larger / additional waiting areas. The impact of smaller developments is harder to evidence in terms of healthcare provision particularly as development often takes place piecemeal. However, the effects can be significant, particularly on a practice that is used to catering for small village communities. We note the comments about access to the local surgery. Biodiversity and Green Spaces We are very supportive of your approach to ensuring that any developments are sympathetic to the existing green spaces and note your commitment to increase access to green spaces. This is particularly important as part of delivering activity opportunity and well-being support to local communities. As a member of the Buckinghamshire Natural Environment Partnership we welcome your support for biodiversity and like you we would want the planning system to contribute to and enhance the natural and local environment minimising impacts on biodiversity and providing net gains in biodiversity where possible. This would also support wellbeing and mental and physical health management in the local area.
