Dear Sir,

The open field south of my property and adjacent to our immediate neighbour, Summerhill is, I understand, included in the DM11 Green Spaces policy.

I strongly support the designation of this as a green space on the following basis:

- Since the development of the Four Winds site, this piece of land is now the last remaining precious piece of natural environment and is a haven for local wildlife
- The field is in an elevated position and is visible from the valley below and also from the hill on the other side of the Thames, Winter Hill in Cookham.
- The area overall, including the field, is an area of great beauty and the open country green space provides a great relief from the many built up areas nearby
- The field is a natural boundary between a built up area up Hawks Hill and open country. Building on the field will extend the building line into open country and would be an extension of ribbon development along Hawks Hill/Hedsor Hill. Extending the building line risks providing precedent for further development in an area of great natural beauty.
- The field is the start of open country and the view of the field, and across it to the country beyond, is enjoyed by road users including walkers, cyclists and indeed car drivers.
